BoG:32-3	<p>Presentation of Director's Report.</p> <p>The Director made a brief presentation before the Board of Governors (BoG) on significant developments of the Institute since the last meeting and action taken on different issues for information of the Board.</p> <p>Following are the excerpts of the report:</p> <p>1. <u>On Admission Front:</u></p> <p>Admissions to the current Academic Calendar are encouraging and there is significant improvement in IITBBS as choice. Closing Ranks went up very high number (as much as 300 positions) in-spite of increase of seats. This kind of steep rise is being experienced for the first time in the history of IIT Bhubaneswar.</p>

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Chairman appreciated the efforts put on by all the faculty and staff particularly by the Director in setting up the system and trends. He expressed that this is a good indicator of the steady development of the Institute.

2. On Placement Front:

IIT Bhubaneswar marked a remarkable near 100% placement in M.Sc Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry. The institute attained all time high in Core Jobs and probably the highest among all IITs including Sr. IITs. Average Salary of the successful candidates is Rs. 11.5 lakhs. This has been achieved without providing any soft skill training to the students. There has been 15% hike in the pay package and average salary of the students compared to last year. The break-up of the percentage of B.Tech placements branch wise are as follows:

- (i) CSE-100%
- (ii) EE-95%
- (iii) CES -95%
- (iv) Civil-80%
- (v) SMMME-80%

Chairman congratulated the Director for this tremendous improvement of the Institute and expressed that these parameters are the indicators that the Institute is improving in the right direction and way.

3. On progress of the Institute:

The year 2018 has been an important year for the institute as the entire Central Administration shifted to its own campus making the whole institute operational from one roof since 14th July 2018. This was a big dream of all the employees of the institute which could be realised in a record time of 2.5 to 3 years. The land which was not habitable three years back is built and developed into an outstanding matured campus. The most coveted Administrative Building was also occupied by the Institute as per the declared plan even before handing over by CPWD as some of the work inside the structure were not completed by CPWD, though they promised to complete the same by end of March 2018.

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The Institute occupied it in spite of all constraints as the primary target was to make the Institute fully functional from its allotted land and since a date for handing over was not in sight (changing of promised dates of completion).

4. On construction Front:

Majority of the construction work of Phase-II has reached to a very satisfying level. IIT Bhubaneswar aggressively moved ahead in construction of two hostels in anticipation and to move the students residing outside the campus, into the campus. The present strength of the student's i.e 1765, can go up significantly high next year, in view of the raised intake, two years back. Now it is essential that these two hostels are made ready by the coming academic session. On this student strength (B.Tech.) we are second only to IIT Hyderabad among the 2nd generation IITs.

Tendering of all the approved projects are completed by NBCC. Institute is constantly monitoring the work of the contractors and attempts to ensure that quality of work is happening all around. Director himself also goes for inspection, almost on alternative days by holding NBCC responsible from the day one. This is very crucial to maintain the quality which is likely to live up to 100 years for the institute.

5. On Faculty Selection

Action is being taken on rising the faculty strength in the institute. Of late, there has been a significant rise in both quality and quantity of applications being received in the institute. At Present the faculty strength is 129. We are still short by 40 members going by student strength. Another set of faculty selections for 5 disciplines is scheduled for next month. Ensuring Quality is being given utmost importance. The Visiting Faculty is also getting selected in other new IIT's as regular faculty.

Many of the applications being received for senior Visiting Faculty are found to be from good Universities including some reputed foreign ones.

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Chairman appreciated the effort of the Director for taking the pain in ensuring quality appointments and attempts for raising standards of Academic teaching Learning.

Chairman also appreciated Institute's present security system and its operation and expressed high satisfaction in its raised standards.

While the Institute is improving in all directions and being acknowledged by many, a few of the insiders are still trying to destabilise the institute as a whole and sending some forged letters to high offices of the country. The institute has been handing over such letters to local police to help bringing such culprits to book.

This supersedes the previous approved budget of for the same work worth Rs. 2,26,37,300.00.</p> <p>Chairman, BoG categorically emphasized that firefighting measures must be given top most priority in all construction sites while excluding the work and contract.</p>
BoG:32-6	<p>To consider and approve signing of the agreement with HEFA for sanction of Rs.275 crore loan by them. For availing the same, institute requires opening of two exclusive ESCRO Accounts and execution of three agreements.</p> <p>Board endorsed the recommendation of the FC towards signing of the Agreements with HEFA along with other partner banks to get loan required for the ongoing construction work at the Institute. Present agreement of loan must be for an amount of Rs. 275 cr. out of the total sanction of Rs. 550 cr.</p> <p>Board authorized the Registrar of the Institute to sign the agreements with Director's approval on behalf of the Institute and it also approved payment of stamp duty of Rs. 10 Lakhs for the purpose.</p>

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BoG:32-7	<p>To consider and approve release of payment to M/s MEIL on supply of bulk water to IIT Bhubaneswar against the agreed terms of the tri-patriate agreement.</p> <p>Board took a serious note of the entire process of signing of the contract with the State Govt. and the Pvt. Party without knowing the pros. and cons. Board further expressed that even the fundamental basis of calculation of Institute requirement of water to be 5 MLD itself looks unscientific and unrealistic. Present demand cannot be confused with another 10 times hike at the time of visualisation.</p> <p>Institute cannot afford to waste water just for the sake of pouring it inside the campus. The basic calculation of its consumption pattern looks defective. Moreover, the institute has no storage space and maintenance of such huge volume will be critical.</p> <p>Even if the negotiation failed, the institute must take up the matter with highest of the authorities of the Govt. In the meanwhile, the entire document along with copies of correspondences be forwarded to MHRD (as volunteered by them) for taking up the matter with Govt. of Odisha.</p> <p>Chairman, appreciated the views of MHRD asking the Institute to share documents for them to take up the matter with Govt. of Odisha for a practicable solution as commendable.</p>
BoG:32-8	<p>To consider and approve the Policy on Continuing Education Program of the Institute.</p> <p>Board approved the recommendation of the FC on policy on Continuing Education formulated by the Institute for implementation based on the clearance of MHRD vide their comments dated 20.09.2018. Since, the proposed policy is a more refined version of the existing one which was based on IIT Kharagpur model and also includes refresher and other continuing education courses for faculty and working professionals, organization of conferences / workshops etc. it will be beneficial to the Institute.</p> <p>Board also agreed to the operational mechanism of the policy towards deposit of overhead charges of all internal accounts to Institute account.</p>
